Glenn County residents with dry or intermittent wells can apply to get free water deliveries from North Valley Community Foundation.

NVCF is helping deliver both drinking water and nonpotable water to residents in partnership with Glenn County after receiving a grant from the state Department of Water Resources.

For drinking water, up to 60 gallons of water (12 five-gallon bottles) is delivered per month. For nonpotable uses, like laundry and showers, the program provides a 1,500-gallon tank that can be filled with up to two deliveries of 1,250 gallons each month.

A total of 120 households have signed up for the program. The state assistance is capped at 200 homes.
